2020 CFA CHALLENGE COMPETITION: BCB TEAM #1 IN KAZAKHSTAN AND # 2 IN CENTRAL ASIA





We are proud to announce that BCB team won 2nd place in the regional CFA Research Challenge Competition 2020 that was held in Almaty on 23 February, 2020. Our team, one of 5 Kazakhstan teams in the regional finals, presented a report on "JSC Halyk Bank Equity Research". The first place in the Competition was taken by the Westminster International University in Tashkent (Uzbekistan) and third place by the Nazarbayev University (Kazakhstan).

The members of the 2020 BCB CFA team are: Duman Imanbayev, Altynay Mukhatova, Aruzhan Shalkhybayeva, Gavkharkhon Mamadzhanova, and Kundiz Kuandikova. The team expresses their gratitude to Dr. Keun Jung Lee for mentoring the team and to Bibigul Zhakupova (leader of BCB teams, Chair of department of Accounting and Finance), Dr. Olga Uzhegova, Dr. Yelzhas Aubakirov, Dr. Muhammad Arslan, and Dr. Kunsu Park for their help during the team's preparation.

Dr. Keun Jung Lee says: "This news evidences that the BCB department of Finance is #1 among all universities of Kazakhstan. If you remember, in 2017 BCB team (Umarzoda, Mulloboeva, Ablikimova, Sadir, and Tuleugazy) also won in the CFA Institute Research Challenge for Central Asia region, securing1 position among 24 teams from 12 universities".

CFA Institute Research Challenge is an annual global competition that provides university students with hands-on mentoring and training in financial analysis and professional ethics. Participants were tested on their analytical, valuation, report writing and presentation skills. More than 6,000 students from 1,000 universities take part in CFA Institute Research Challenge each year.







TATISHEV FOUNDATION OFFERS SCHOLARSHIP SUPPORT TO BACHELOR OF MANAGEMENT PROGRAM

On March 6, 2020, Dr. Chan Young Bang, Dr. Barnett and Dr. Linne welcomed Mr. Yerkin Tatishev, the Founder of Tatishev Foundation and Ms. Dana Zharikova, President of the Foundation to KIMEP campus and expressed the University's appreciation of the Foundation's contribution to the development of human capital in the Republic of Kazakhstan, as well as for the 12 years of the Foundation's generous scholarship support of the talented KIMEP students. Besides, the Foundation gives the program fellows seed money to start their business and an opportunity to attend entrepreneurship summer camp at the Babson College, USA.

BCB SUBMITS ELIGIBILITY APPLICATION TO EFMD

On April 29, 2020, BCB officially submitted an eligibility application to *EFMD Program Accreditation System* (*EPAS*). The application consisted of EPAS Pre-eligibility Datasheet and Advisor's Pre-Eligibility Assessment Evaluation. The application will be considered at the next meeting of *EPAS Committee* and results will be conveyed to KIMEP in June-July 2020.

Overall, so far, the speed of BCB progress in its EPAS accreditation journey, as well as the quality of accreditation documents prepared by BCB, received positive comments from the EFMD experts. Taking this opportunity, we wanted to thank BCB management, as well as all the faculty members, departments and units of KIMEP who contributed to the development of the accreditation documents for their continuous support of this important collective endeavor.

We are pleased to introduce to you the professional who helps BCB in its accreditation journey with *European Foundation for Management Development (EFMD)*. **Dr. Tatiana Garanina** is a member of international *EPAS Peer Review Teams* since 2015, and a member of *EFMD Board of Trustees* since June, 2018.

Being a member of the European Accounting Association, American Accounting Association, European Academy of Management, European Finance Association, Tatiana authors over 30 articles on intellectual capital evaluation, evaluation of company efficiency and profitability, value-based management and corporate governance. Dr. Garanina's paper «Intellectual capital research: A critical examination of the third stage», co-authored with John Dumay from Macquarie University, Australia, got the Emerald Citations of Excellence Award in 2016.





Currently Dr. Tatiana Garanina is

an Associate Professor in the School of Accounting and Finance at University of Vaasa, Finland. Before joining the University of Vaasa, Tatiana worked at the Graduate School of Management (GSOM) of St.Petersburg State University. GSOM is the first Russian business school to enter *Financial Times rankings* and the only one possessing both *EQUIS* and *AMBA* accreditation. Dr Garanina has a considerable undergraduate and graduate teaching experience at GSOM, as well as at the School of Economics (University of Turku, Finland) and School of Business Lappeenranta (University of Technology, Finland). In GSOM, Dr Garanina supervised graduate programs in management, including Executive MBA programs.

In this material we wanted to focus specifically on the help and care demonstrated by Bloomberg LP. Soon after the beginning of distance learning mode, computer class in the KIMEP Residence Hall received a *one month trial version of Bloomberg terminal* at no cost.

Later, the company opened free-of-charge access to 300 online licenses of Bloomberg Market Concept (BMC) course (each license being worth USD 149). Online BMC licenses allow students to take the course from the comfort of their homes. The 10-hours course covers most aspects of Finance (equities, fixed income, commodities, economics and portfolio management) and successful students receive a certificate that is helpful to their future careers.



THE 17TH KIMEP INTERNATIONAL RESEARCH CONFERENCE GOES ONLINE

On April 17-18, 2020, for the first time in its two decades' history the annual KIMEP International Research Conference (KIRC) went completely online. The decision for this remarkable shift was made when the Conference gathered over 90 paper submissions from local and foreign Universities despite of the restrictions imposed by the COVID-19 pandemic.

The multidisciplinary Conference devoted to the "Challenges and Opportunities for Economy, Business, and Society in Central Asia and beyond" was organized in 21 ZOOM sessions that were open to participants and wider public. All the sessions went smoothly and allowed for an open exchange of ideas and knowledge. The innovative mode of the Conference was well received by the participants representing a number of various universities.

DR. KEUN JUNG LEE IS APPOINTED A MEMBER OF SOUTH KOREAN PRESIDENTIAL COMMITTEE ON NORTHERN ECONOMIC COOPERATION

In June 2017 South Korean Government under direct leadership of President of the Republic of Korea, Moon Jae-in, established the Presidential Committee on Northern Economic Cooperation to promote economic cooperation and development in the Eurasian region. The Committee is established to strengthen cooperation between the Republic of Korea and northern countries such as Russia, Mongolia, and Kazakhstan in a number of fields, to upgrade the cooperation strategy and yield practical cooperative results.

Initially, the Committee consisted of 25 civilians and 5 government officials. Later, the number of civilian members was reduced to 19 invited experts from various sectors such as finance, international relations, infrastructure, and heads of national research institutes from Russia, China, and Central Asia.

We are glad to inform you that on February 13, 2020, Dr. Keun Jung Lee, Associate Professor of Finance at Bang College of Business, was invited as one of the selected experts.

In the result, each session was attended by twice the number of intended listeners. The LDP administration now considers options on how to incorporate the format into the program curriculum even after the end of quarantine.

Seizing this opportunity, we approached Niyaz, asking for a brief interview through Telegram.

BCB Newsletter (BN): Thank you for agreeing for the interview! Would you please tell us about yourself?

Niyaz Askerbek: Currently, I am studying finance in my third year of Bachelor's degree and have my own IT business. The business has a variety of clients such as KIMEP, online learning entrepreneurs, restaurants and film industry. My responsibilities include developing automation and attracting clients through Telegram, Whatsapp, Facebook and Viber




Bots. The recently released KIMEP University Telegram Chat Bot allows students to instantaneously find answers to frequently asked questions and get connected to responsible managers while also decreasing the workload of administration. Currently, due to the emergency situation of COVID19, students have a lot of inquiries about Distance Education and KIMEP University Chat Bot helps hundreds of students handling thousands of questions.



BN: How did you find the idea of your business?

Niyaz Askerbek: Last year I went to Spain as an exchange student. I travelled around Europe and visited 11 countries, meeting different people and discussing current topics on globalisation and technology. There were software engineers from Google, insurance company "Allianz» and financiers from French banks. After traveling, I realized that I cannot waste time as before, because we have all the resources to get new skills through the Internet and it is only up to us if we decide to learn it or not.

I started watching different courses on finance, investment, IT and marketing. I started subscribing to channels in Telegram and writing to all the authors of the channels: «Good afternoon! My name is Niyaz. I'd like to meet with you, if you do not mind." Some of them answered and some of them didn't. And one day, I got in touch with a guy who was an entrepreneur and lived in New York. He was 29 years old at that time and I was 19.



I asked him, what he would advise to himself 10 years ago. He told me: «You have 10 years to try out all fields of business and understand where your soul stays and at 30 years old you start paving your way». That's how he suggested me to learn the growing field of chat bots for business, but I didn't go into that field at that time. Only after a while, when in one semester I failed a subject and thus lost money spent on that subject, I promised myself that I will make money during the summer. That's how I started studying the niche of bots.


When I first started developing Telegram bots, I often thought, «Did I make the right decision?". Nevertheless, with each passing day by developing bots, I began to understand how bots may bring advantages to society and help millions of people. As many CEOs say, «Already in the near future, the competitiveness of companies will be determined by their level of digitalization.» Therefore, I am sure that I have chosen the right field of activity. In the near future I would like to be an entrepreneur in IT and become one of those who will connect business with information technology in our business market.

BN: What would be your advice to KIMEP students?

Niyaz Askerbek: I would like to advise students to develop their knowledge, not to dwell on the basic

knowledge of their specialty and use all of the resources of the university. During my three years of study, I noticed that a lot of students do not take advantage of the opportunities that the university provides. Some students do not check their mail at all. However, there you could find a lot of interesting things. We should try to develop ourselves comprehensively during our student years and hold on to every opportunity. For example, I was an exchange student and visited 11 countries. Every Wednesday and Thursday I attended a leadership program and listened to different speakers. Now, I have applied to a program seeking for mentorship in order to improve my professional skills. Therefore, I think that students should hold on to every opportunity to gain knowledge, develop comprehensively and invest in themselves, because our main asset is our knowledge. Do not waste your time. Simply seek knowledge and use given resources.
